Request for Funds-Carolyn Ramsay, Jamara Washington (4th grade)
4th grade was "inspired" by Kindergarten so they are requesting funds to purchase owl pellets. As owls eat, certain items get wrapped up in the pellet. Students would dissect the pellet and try to recognize and identify the different bones they find. Everything is sanitary, but kids love it. It aligns with their Life Science Unit (Interdependence). One of our SIP plans is to increase science exposure. It helps build motivation as the students move into 5th grade. Ms. Baxter found a book called *Poppy* which has an owl as the main character and Poppy interacts with all the other animals. The animals Poppy meets are the same animals on the bone charts. This is a way to incorporate literacy into science.
